

GENERAL RULES FOR PARTICIPANTS AT OIL CITY JACKPOT 2020 :

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Oil City jackpot is open to any youth age 4-21 as of January 1, 2020.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

1. All animals registered to show must have a paper copy of a current and valid certificate of veterinary inspection.
2. All livestock (both in and out of state) may be subject to a health inspection if show management deems necessary.
3. If any animal is disqualified for health issues, the entry will be removed with no refund.

GENERAL RULES FOR OIL CITY JACKPOT:

1. Participants will not be allowed to abuse, strike, kick, hit, or mistreat animals. Unethical treatment will result in dismissal for the show.
2. Oil City Jackpot will not be responsible for any accidents. Oil City Jackpot will not and cannot be held liable for any injury or harm to persons or animals.
3. Exhibitors will follow facility rules.
4. All exhibitors will be responsible for their own tack and show supplies. Oil City Jackpot will not be responsible for any theft of property.
5. All jackpot payouts are dependent on the amount of entrants, unless otherwise advertised. Awards under \$50.00 that are not claimed by the end of the last show of the weekend will not be mailed. All proceeds of the show go to fund the Natrona County Goat Project and towards next seasons OCJ.
6. Participants must conduct themselves in a respectful manner, displaying good sportsmanship in and out of the ring. No arguing with ring judges or show committee will be tolerated.

7. No illegal substances or non-food supplements should be used to prepare animals for show, if need be Oil City jackpot can test and or deny awards, winnings and report issues to RMJSS.

8. Oil City Jackpot has the right to dismiss or ban any person not complying with these rules.

9. No refunds of entry fees.

A final word:

The Oil City Jackpot was designed to be a fundraiser for the Natrona County Goat Project. Any profits gained from the show are used to further the goat project in Natrona County and to make the Oil City Jackpot self sustaining. The management is made up of people who volunteer their time to ensure a safe and fair, show environment for kids and families to experience the excitement of livestock showing.

We have mimicked the majority of the Rocky Mountain Jackpot Show Series rules in order to keep this simple. We may have some rules that stem from necessity due to the location or our show and rules of the grounds.
